When asked about what the worst example of this was, he told me a story that I remember quite well. "We had the cameras, so that we could record a mass.







In 2023, people were waiting and waiting for the release of a special game, one that was announced all the way back in 2019. The game in question is the sequel to the hit Open World game: The Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild. The sequel was given a bit of a sneak peak a while back, and was later named Tears of the Kingdom. Now, the game has finally been released, and it's just as good, if not better than we all expected!

In the game, the protagonist Link, a knight chosen to protect the royal family of Hyrule, goes under Hyrule castle with the wise princess Zelda, to investigate a strange evil substance leaking out from under the castle. There, they find ancient ruins, left behind by Zelda's ancestors, the Zonai, and a dried up mummy, with a glowing arm seemingly holding it down. The mummy comes alive, and attacks Link and Zelda with an evil energy, shattering Link's sword and wounding his arm. The castle rises into the sky, and Zelda falls into the darkness below. Link wakes up on a deserted island in the middle of the sky, and finds that his wounded arm has been replaced by a powerful new one, the arm of King Rauru of the Zonai. Rauru's ghost guides link through the island's many twists and turns. Link eventually obtains many special powers, allowing for a lot of creativity. For example, with the ultrahand ability you can levitate objects and move them freely, allowing you to attach them to create amazing contraptions. Link also has the ability to go through ceilings, rewind time, and stick weapons and items together.

The game has a vast world allowing for a lot of exploration. There are so many areas to explore and secrets to find, that you'll never get bored exploring. The worldbuilding and lore is really fascinating. For example, you might find an abandoned temple, sunken in a pond. Later in the game, you could find an article written on a wall, explaining how in the past, a temple sank into a pond after being sieged. While not explicitly stating where it's found, it adds a sense of mystery. You can do almost anything in this game, whether it be building wacky contraptions, exploring the vast world, hunting for treasure, photographing and research Hyrule's flora and fauna, becoming a great chef, build friendships with all of the quirky characters who inhabit the kingdom, or become a hero and save the world. This game has something for everyone, and will be a blast to play if you check it out. Note that the game is recommended for people over the age of 8 due to its difficulty and dark themes, so make sure it's the game for you before you play!

Nearer and dearer to him.


